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Florida Virtual School® Launches All New Elementary Curriculum

Students can complete lessons following their own schedule, reflect on their own experiences to connect their learning, choose their own topics or materials for activities, and participate in online live lessons called "Class Time" with other students.

Custom activities were built specifically for the FLVS elementary courses to feel game-like, and fun storylines guide them through each module. In Spanish, students journey to a different country. In Science, they become an inventor in a toy factory. In Art, they go *inside* paintings to learn techniques. Throughout the courses, different characters guide students through their learning, making the experience feel more personal.

A virtual elementary school is unlike any school in the real world. In a virtual classroom, students can journey with an astronaut to see the stars in one module, and travel on safari to Africa in another. They can learn about plant structures, build a model at home, and go on a nature walk to find examples in their own environment. Students can learn about erosion while at the beach. The opportunities are limitless.


