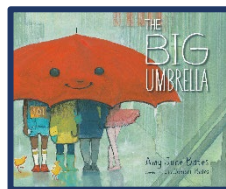

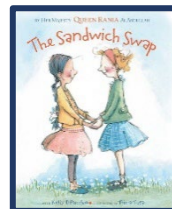

- If your child is transitioning in the middle of a segment, save their current grades by logging in to your parent account and clicking on the top left 3-bar menu, then Student Records, then Cumulative Academic Report. Next, save and print your child's grades. Once they have been withdrawn, you will lose access to their grades.
- Withdraw student from the district Home Ed Program by sending a Letter of Termination
- Update your child's account to reflect their physical school
